CHAFFEE COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT**

**AMENDED RESOLUTION PROPOSING INCLUSION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY
WITHIN THE TOWN OF BUENA VISTA INTO THE CHAFFEE COUNTY FIRE
PROTECTION DISTRICT AND SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON**

WHEREAS, the Chaffee County Fire Protection District ("***District***") is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado, organized pursuant to the Special District Act, C.R.S. § 32-1-101, *et seq.*, to provide fire and emergency services to the citizens and property within its jurisdictional boundaries (collectively, "***Emergency Services***");

WHEREAS, the area within the District's jurisdictional boundaries includes a small portion of the area within the corporate boundaries of the town of Buena Vista ("***Town***"), which area receives the same Emergency Services the District provides to the rest of the area within its jurisdictional boundaries;

WHEREAS, since 2021, the District has provided Emergency Services to the rest of the area within the Town's corporate boundaries that is not within the District's jurisdictional boundaries, which area is depicted on the attached **Exhibit A** ("***Subject Area***");

WHEREAS, at its regular public meeting on May 6, 2026, the District's Board of Directors ("***Board***") carefully evaluated the options for providing sustainable, high quality, and cost-effective Emergency Services to the citizens and property within its existing service territory and within the Subject Area, and determined that it would be more efficient and would best support the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens within the District's existing service territory and the Subject Area if all real property located within the Subject Area is included into the District's jurisdictional boundaries;

WHEREAS, at the May 6th meeting, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2026-10, which a) proposed including the Subject Area within the District's jurisdictional boundaries, and b) set a public hearing for June 3, 2026 ("***Inclusion Hearing***"), to consider final adoption of a resolution approving inclusion of the Subject Area upon the affirmative majority vote of the eligible electors within the Subject Area at an election ordered by the Chaffee County District Court in accordance with C.R.S. § 32-1-401(2)(d); and,

WHEREAS, the Board desires to replace Resolution No. 2026-10 with this Resolution and reschedule the Inclusion Hearing from June 3rd to June 18, 2026, at 11:30 a.m. at Station 1, 499 Antero Circle, Buena Vista, Colorado 81211.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CHAFFEE COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT THAT:

1. This Resolution supersedes and replaces Resolution No. 2026-10 in its entirety.
2. The Board shall hold a special meeting on June 18, 2026, at 11:30 a.m. for the purpose of conducting the Inclusion Hearing to consider final adoption of a proposed *Resolution Approving*

Inclusion of Certain Real Property within the Town of Buena Vista into Chaffee County Fire Protection District's Jurisdictional Boundaries Upon the Affirmative Majority Vote of the Eligible Electors within the Subject Area in substantially the form attached as **Exhibit B** ("**Inclusion Resolution**"). The Inclusion Hearing shall be held at Station 1, 499 Antero Circle, Buena Vista, CO 81211.

3. The District shall publish notice of the special meeting at which the Inclusion Hearing will be held at least 24 hours in advance of the special meeting, which notice shall be in substantially the form attached as **Exhibit C**. In addition, the District shall post on its website a notice and agenda for the special meeting, and information for attending virtually, at least 24 hours before the special meeting. The notice and agenda shall also be available by contacting the District at (719) 395-6545.

4. The District shall mail to all property owners within the Subject Area a notice of the proposed inclusion and of the special meeting and Inclusion Hearing to consider final adoption of the proposed Inclusion Resolution. The notice to the property owners shall be in substantially the form attached as **Exhibit D**.

5. All interested persons, and any municipality or county that may be able to provide Emergency Services to the Subject Area, shall appear at the Inclusion Hearing and show cause in writing why the Board should not finally adopt the Inclusion Resolution. The failure of any person to file a written objection shall be taken as an assent on their part to the inclusion of the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING INCLUSION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWN OF BUENA VISTA INTO CHAFFEE COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT'S JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES UPON THE AFFIRMATIVE MAJORITY VOTE OF THE ELIGIBLE ELECTORS WITHIN THE SUBJECT AREA.

THIS MATTER comes before the Board of Directors ("**Board**") of the Chaffee County Fire Protection District ("**District**") to include into the District jurisdictional boundaries all real property within the Town of Buena Vista ("**Town**") that is not already located within the District, which area is depicted on the map attached as **Exhibit A** ("**Subject Area**"), upon the affirmative majority vote of the eligible electors within the Subject Area, pursuant to Section 32-1-401(2) of the Colorado Revised Statutes ("**C.R.S.**").

WHEREAS, the District is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado, organized pursuant to the Special District Act, C.R.S. §32-1-101, *et seq.*, to provide fire and emergency services to the citizens and property within its jurisdictional boundaries (collectively, "**Emergency Services**");

WHEREAS, a small portion of the area within the Town's corporate boundaries also lies within the District's jurisdictional boundaries and receives the same Emergency Services the District provides to the rest of the area within its jurisdictional boundaries;

WHEREAS, in addition, since 2021 the District has provided Emergency Services within the Subject Area pursuant to a service agreement with the Town in exchange for the Town paying the District an annual amount that is intended to equal the annual amount the District would receive in property and specific ownership taxes if the Subject Area was within the District's jurisdictional boundaries;

WHEREAS, during a public meeting on May 19, 2026 the Board adopted an *Amended Resolution Proposing Inclusion of Certain Real Property within the Town of Buena Vista into the Chaffee County Fire Protection District and Setting a Public Hearing Thereon* ("**Proposing Resolution**");

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-401(2)(b), the District duly published notice of the Board's adoption of the Proposing Resolution and that the Board would hold a public meeting on June 18, 2026 for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on whether the Board should finally adopt a Resolution to include the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries upon the affirmative majority vote of the eligible electors within the Subject Area. The notice of the public meeting and hearing is attached as **Exhibit 1**;

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-401(3), between May 19 and May 29, 2026, the District also mailed a letter notification that a public meeting and hearing would be held on June 18, 2026

("Property Owner Notice") to the owners of each of the properties located within the Subject Area, as listed on the records of the Chaffee County Assessor on the date requested;

WHEREAS, the Property Owner Notice stated that it is a notice of a public meeting and hearing to consider inclusion of the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries and indicated the date, time, location, and purpose of the public meeting and hearing, a reference to the type of special district proposed for inclusion, the District's current maximum voter-approved mill levy, and procedures for the filing of a petition for exclusion pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-203(3.5). A sample copy of the Property Owner Notice is attached as **Exhibit 2**;

WHEREAS, on June 18, 2026, the Board held a public meeting and conducted a public hearing to consider final adoption of a Resolution including the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries upon the affirmative majority vote of the eligible electors within the Subject Area. During the public hearing, the Board received the following comments: [TBD – Insert as appropriate];

[TBD – Insert as appropriate - **WHEREAS**, no municipality or county that can provide adequate Emergency Services within the Subject Area within a reasonable time and on a comparable basis appeared at the June 18, 2026 public hearing or filed a written objection to the proposed inclusion;]

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-401(2), the Board may adopt a resolution to include real property within its jurisdictional boundaries upon the affirmative majority vote of the eligible electors within the area to be included at an election conducted by the District pursuant to the Colorado Uniform Election Code, C.R.S. § 1-1-101, *et seq.*, and the Colorado Local Government Election Code, C.R.S. § 1-13.5-101, *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined it is in the best interest of the District, the Subject Area, and the property owners and citizens within the Subject Area to hold a coordinated mail ballot election on November 3, 2026, for the purpose of submitting to the eligible electors of the Subject Area a ballot question requesting voter approval to include all of the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries.

NOW THEREFORE, having considered the proposed inclusion, including all information and public comments received during the public meeting and hearing, the Board hereby:

- a. Approves including all of the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries upon the affirmative majority vote of the eligible electors within the Subject Area; and
- b. Directs that Chief Staff and legal counsel petition the Chaffee County District Court to order that a coordinated mail ballot election shall be conducted on November 3, 2026, for the purpose of seeking voter approval to include the Subject Area into the District's jurisdictional boundaries. At the election, the Chaffee County Clerk and Recorder shall serve as the Designated Election Official ("**DEO**"), and [TBD – INSERT] shall serve as the District's local election official. The DEO and local election official shall have full authority to take any and all actions necessary and appropriate to conduct the election in accordance with the requirements of applicable law.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING AND HEARING TO CONSIDER
FINAL ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION FOR INCLUSION OF REAL
PROPERTY INTO CHAFFEE COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at 11:30 a.m. on Thursday, June 18, 2026, the Board of Directors (“Board”) of the Chaffee County Fire Protection District ("District") will hold a public meeting and hearing to consider a proposed "Resolution Approving Inclusion of Certain Real Property within the Town of Buena Vista into Chaffee County Fire Protection District's Jurisdictional Boundaries Upon the Affirmative Majority Vote of the Eligible Electors within the Subject Area," and to submit the question of said inclusion to the eligible electors of the area proposed for inclusion at an election to be held on November 3, 2026. The area proposed to be included is all real property located within the Town of Buena Vista’s municipal boundaries that is not already located within the District's jurisdictional boundaries.

The public meeting and hearing will be held at the District’s Fire Station No. 1, located at 499 Antero Circle, Buena Vista, Colorado. A notice and agenda of the public meeting and hearing will be posted to the District’s website no later than 24 hours before the meeting and hearing, and will provide information for the option of attending virtually.

Copies of the proposed Resolution and a map of the area proposed to be included are available for public inspection at the address above. Questions prior to the public meeting and hearing should be directed to the District’s administrative office at (719) 395-6545.

All interested persons, municipalities, and counties that may be able to provide emergency services to the area to be included shall appear at the public meeting and hearing and show cause in writing why the Board should not adopt a final resolution to include the area and to obtain a court order to hold an election on November 3, 2026, on the question of including of the area into the District’s jurisdictional boundaries. The Board may continue the public meeting and hearing to a subsequent meeting. The failure of any person to file a written objection shall be taken as an assent on his or her part to the inclusion of the area into the Chaffee County Fire Protection District's jurisdictional boundaries.

Re: **Property Owner Notice Pursuant to Section 32-1-401(3) of the Colorado Revised Statutes** – June 18, 2026 Public Meeting and Hearing of the Chaffee County Fire Protection District Board of Directors on Whether to Finally Adopt a Resolution to Include Certain Area within the Town of Buena Vista into the Fire District’s Boundaries.

Dear Property Owner:

The Chaffee County Assessor's records show you own real property in the Town of Buena Vista, Colorado. As you may know, the Town’s citizens and their property receive fire suppression, fire protection, emergency rescue and extrication, hazardous materials, and emergency medical services from the Chaffee County Fire Protection District, which is a special district organized under the Colorado Special District Act to provide these services; however, most of the Town, including your property, is not within the Fire District’s boundaries. This letter refers to that area of the Town as the “Affected Area.” A map of the Affected Area is enclosed.

Since 2021 the Town has paid the Fire District to provide emergency services to the Affected Area. To provide more efficient emergency services to the Town’s citizens and their property, and to give eligible citizens in the Affected Area the opportunity to serve on the Board of Directors that governs the Fire District, the Board is considering including the Affected Area into the Fire District's boundaries.

On June 18, 2026, the Board will conduct a public meeting and hearing on whether to finally adopt a resolution to include the Affected Area into the Fire District’s boundaries. If the Board adopts the resolution, the Fire District will petition the Chaffee County District Court to order an election on November 3, 2026, asking the voters in the Affected Area if it should be included into the Fire District. The public meeting and hearing will be held at 11:30 a.m. on June 18, 2026, at the Fire District’s Station No. 1, which is located at 499 Antero Circle, Buena Vista, CO 81211. At least 24 hours before the public meeting and hearing, the Fire District will post on its website a notice and agenda that will include information for the option to attend virtually.

The Fire District is currently authorized to assess a general operating property tax of 3.963 mills, which may be adjusted in accordance with the revenue stabilization Ballot Issue 6A that the voters approved in 2018. The Fire District is not subject to a maximum mill levy that it may assess; however, like other local governments in Colorado, its property tax revenue growth is capped at 5.25% annually (10.5% every two years) and the Fire District is subject to Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution (TABOR), which prohibits the Fire District from increasing its property taxes without prior voter approval.

Following the procedures in Section 32-1-203(3.5) of the Colorado Revised Statutes, any person owning property within the Town may request that their property be excluded from the Fire District prior to approval of the Resolution by submitting their request to the Board no later than 10 days prior to the hearing (i.e., by June 8, 2026). The Board will act on any request for exclusion before it takes final action to approve or reject the Resolution.
